1951 Carters Creek Pike, Franklin, Tennessee, Williamson County


Dear Mr. McIntyre:

I am writing to provide notice to the Tennessee Historical Commission, pursuant to T.C.A. § 46-4-103, of the filing of a petition to terminate the use of land as a burial ground. Our client, RBP Tennessee, LLC, owns property located at 1951 Carters Creek Pike. According to prior deeds for the property, a small parcel that is interior to a larger tract at that address—but in which our client has an interest—was reserved as a cemetery in 1921 by the then-owners.

The land was recently examined by an archeologist, and the archeologist was unable to find any graves or remains. Additionally, ground penetrating radar has been used to search the land, and no burials or remains were located by that process. Thus, we are asking the Williamson County Chancery Court to declare the area reserved as a cemetery abandoned, and to partition and sell the tract—after giving any interested party who may believe there are remains there an opportunity to discover, remove, and reinter the same.

I have included with this notice a copy of the Petition and Amended Petition which we filed on behalf of our client in the Williamson County Chancery Court. Those documents which contain the archeologist's and ground penetrating radar provider's reports. Please let me know if the Commission requires any additional information, filings, or documentation at this time.
