


Annual Monthly Income in Dollars

	Child Medically Needy	Children up to age 21. Must either have low income OR have sufficient unreimbursed medical bills to spend down to requisite income limits.	Monthly spend-down levels of \$241 (1), \$258 (2), \$317 (3), \$325 (4), \$392 (5), \$408 (6), \$467 (7), or \$517 (8) Resource: \$2,000 (1), \$3,000 (2), add \$100 per additional individual
	Standard Uninsured	Children under age 19 who do not have access to insurance. Category is only open to children who lose Medicaid eligibility and rollover into Standard.	Below 211% of the poverty level No resource test
	Standard Medically Eligible	Children under age 19 who do not have access to insurance and who have health conditions that make the child uninsurable. Category is only open to children who lose Medicaid eligibility and rollover into Standard.	211% of the poverty level or above.
	CoverKids	Available to children under age 19 and to the unborn children of women not eligible under another TennCare category.	At or below 250% poverty level No resource test
Families	Caretaker Relative	Available to parents and caretaker relatives of dependent children under age 18 or is 18 and a full-time student for the parent to qualify.	Monthly income levels of \$1,018 (1), \$1,329 (2), \$1,611 (3), \$1,867 (4), \$2,102 (5), \$2,320 (6), \$2,524 (7), or \$2,718 (8) No resource test
	Transitional / Extended Medicaid	Children and caretaker relatives who lose Medicaid due to an increase in income or spousal support.	Criteria for Caretaker Relative for 3 of the last 6 months immediately preceding the month eligibility is lost
Women	Pregnant	Low income pregnant women. NOTE: Newborns born to Medicaid –eligible women are deemed eligible for one year.	195% of the poverty level No resource test
	Pregnant Medically Needy	Pregnant women. Must either have low income OR have sufficient unreimbursed medical bills to spend down to requisite income limits. Aged, Blind, Disabled	SSI (Supplemental Security Income)	Active: Low income aged, blind, or disabled recipients of federal SSI cash payments as determined by SSA *Eligibility for SSI is determined by the Social Security Administration (SSA).	\$783 per month (1), \$1,175 (2) Resource: \$2,000 (1), \$3,000 (2)
	Institutional Medicaid	Low income individuals who require care in a medical institution, like a nursing facility or hospital, or intermediate care facility for individuals with intellectual disabilities or who receive Home and Community-Based Services in their home.	\$2,349 per month Resource: \$2,000
	SSI Related (Pickle/Pass-Along, Disabled Adult child, Widow/Widower)	Pickle/Pass Along: Lost SSI since April 1977 due to OASDI cost-of-living increase. DAC: Lost SSI since July 1987 due to receipt/increase of DAC benefits. Widow/Widower: Lost SSI since 1984 due to receipt of OASDI from deceased spouse, does not receive Medicare Part A, and is at least age 50 and up to age 65.	\$783 per month (1), \$1,175 (2) Resource: \$2,000 (1), \$3,000 (2)
	Breast or Cervical Cancer	Individuals under 65 who are not eligible for any other category of Medicaid and have been diagnosed as the result of a screening at a Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) site.	250% of the poverty level No resource test
Adults - Foster Care	Former Foster Care up to Age 26	Individuals under age 26 who aged out of foster care in Tennessee and who received TennCare Medicaid at that time.	No income or resource test
Medicare Cost Sharing	QMB	Qualified Medicare Beneficiary TennCare pays Medicare premiums, deductibles and co-insurance for those eligible for Medicare.	Up to 100% of the poverty level Resource: \$7,860 (1), \$11,800 (2)
	SLMB	Specified Low Income Medicare Beneficiaries TennCare pays Medicare Part B premiums only.	At least 100% but less than 120% of the poverty level Resource: \$7,860 (1), \$11,800 (2)
	QI 1	Qualified Individuals TennCare pays Medicare Part B premiums only. *Individual can't be eligible for another category of Medicaid at the same time.	At least 120% but less than 135% of the poverty level Resource: \$7,860 (1), \$11,800 (2)
	QDWI	Qualified Disabled Working Individual TennCare pays Medicare Part A buy-in for individuals who are no longer entitled to premium-free Medicare Part A because they returned to work.	Not more than 200% of the poverty level Resource: \$4,000 (1), \$6,000 (2)
